Over 100 people attended a breakfast held at the Holiday Inn (on Scottsdale) this morning hosted by the Guelph Provincial Progressive Conservative Association. Sylvia Jones (MPP Dufferin Caledon) spoke on his behalf about ChangeBook, the PC Party’s platform for the October 6th provincial election. Sylvia emphasized that ChangeBook is “not a wish list”.
